# **One-Day Seminar on "Research Article Writing "**

## **1. Background Information**

# 4. Methodology/Delivery

For effective learning, the seminar used a variety of methods such as interactive lecture method, group discussions, and hands-on activities. ## 5. Outputs

The outputs of the seminar are highlighted as follow:

- a) Participants gained a deeper understanding to write the different components of a research article, such as the abstract, introduction, methodology, results, discussion, and conclusion.
- b) Participants gained knowledge on how to write literature reviews, find effective sources, and combine existing research to create a theoretical framework. They also learned about various research methodologies and how they are used in various fields.
- c) Participants in the seminar enhanced their skills in data analysis, they gained knowledge on how to interpret and present research findings accurately and effectively.
- d) Participants learned various writing techniques and using the proper academic writing style. Additionally, they learned about the submission, peer review, and revision stages of the publication process of research article.

# 6. Conclusion

One-Day seminar on "Research Article Writing" organized by Devdaha Aadarsha Multiple Campus successfully raised the fundamental know-how, abilities, and techniques needed to improve research capacities of the participant form DAMC and Butwal Kalika Campus.
